

BOTH JESUS

Before going into this study, it is absolutely vital for the reader to have a good grasp of the rules of the English grammar—specifically punctuation and proper word usage. For this reason small notations will be included in this document to refresh the memory of the reader.

Read the following verse carefully: “AND both Jesus was called, and his disciples, to the marriage.” (**Jn. 2:2**)

All of the experts say the word “both” (in this verse) refers to Jesus and his disciples and people agree with their interpretation. Now the argument begins within a person’s mind (soul) because they have always heard that there is only one Jesus.

When Jesus went up into a mountain and was teaching his disciples. He brought up the subject of the jot and the tittle.

“For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no [way] pass from the law, till all be fulfilled.” (**Matt. 5:18**)

“And it is easier for heaven and earth to pass, than one tittle of the law to fail.” (**Lk. 16:17**)

A jot or a tittle is a point, a sign, or the least bit. i.e. the dot of an “i”, a hyphen, a period, a comma etc.

The correct use of grammar and punctuation is extremely important. Without it, everyone will remain blind to the truth.

Back to John 2:2 carefully giving specific attention to the jots and the tittles (the punctuation).

And both Jesus was called, and his disciples, to the marriage.

The comma after the word “called” is a vital part of the sentence. If a person overlooks the comma he or she will never be able to understand the true interpretation of this verse.

A comma represents a pause, interval, or a mark of separation.

The comma after the word “called” separates the first part of the sentence, “AND both Jesus was called” from the second part of the sentence, “,and his disciples...” Therefore the word “both” applies to the word “Jesus”.

It is impossible to apply the word “both” (which means two) to thirteen people. “Both Jesus” (two Jesus) is correct exactly as it is written.
